Every blogger in Nigeria, and globally, understands how difficult it can be to create original, interesting content. Luckily, there are tools available for bloggers, which can be used to sweep their content before publishing it, helping them maintain the quality of their posts and reduce chances of plagiarism. <u>Jovago.com</u> and IT News Africa list four of these tools below:

Grammarly:

Perfect for beginner bloggers, <u>Grammarly</u> is a browser and application extension tool that helps check content for grammar and spelling to a far further extent than the default program on your computer or word processor. It can also check your content against billions of websites for plagiarism. All you need to do is copy and paste your article into Grammarly's online grammar checker to see how it performs against spelling checks, sentence structure, punctuation, style, and more. While the full version of this tool is not free, it is however very handy as it can be used in Chrome, Outlook or Word.

Hemingway

Hemingway is a grammar checker that is continuously compared to the Grammarly tool; however it is slightly different as it creates a way to check content for readability: it checks your content structure, analyses your text for readability, highlighting sentences that are a bit too complex or dense. The Hemingway tool is easy-to-use, and essentially all you need to do is simply copy and paste your content into its window. It is normally free and can be used on the official website, however, you can also download the desktop application for Windows or Mac, at a cost of \$9.99.

Headline Analyser

Most bloggers focus a lot on the body of the blog post, failing to pay attention to the headline. However, the headline is actually what attracts readers to your post and while you spend time on article content checking and correcting grammar, spelling, and overall structure, you need to optimise that headline as well. The <u>CoSchedule Headline Analyser</u> tool, a free handy online tool helps you analyse your tentative headline, giving you a detailed, graded report on it within seconds. It scores your headline quality and rates its ability to drive social shares, traffic, and SEO value. The report, gives you many

practical tips on how you can make your headline the best possible.

Portent's Content Idea Generator

One of the difficult stages of writing a blog post is the idea generation stage. For most bloggers, coming up with fresh ideas can be an arduous task, especially when they do not have access to external sources. The Portent's Content Idea
Generator tool comes in very handy as it helps the user to generate ideas for blog posts. It is easy-to-use and requires no training whatsoever; all the user has to do is enter the keyword of choice, then hit the 'arrow' sign. The tool then comes up with as many titles or topics to blog about as possible.
